WORKSHOPS WERE CONDUCTED FOR TEACHERS AT VARIOUS VENUES ON A DIVERSE SET OF TOPICS SO AS TO ENHANCE THE METHOD OF INSTRUCTION

Birla Education Trust organised a series of workshops for the teaching faculty of all its schools to enrich them with innovative teaching techniques. The Faculty Development Programme 2016 commenced on 22-6-16 and ended on 29-6-16. The seven day programme began with the opening session and talk by the guest speaker, Mr. NK Ojha Director, Symbiosis International School, Pune. It was followed by a session on the Art of Transforming the Learning Environments by Ms. Veena Raizada. The session focussed on learning styles and learning spaces leading to enhancing experiential learning in school education. The concluding session of the day was on Gender Sensitivity – an issue, relevance of which cuts across all segments of society these days. The resource person for the session was Miss Sunita Devi. The purpose behind conducting this workshop was to bring home to the participants, better understanding of gender sensitivity and generate mutual respect for men and women.

The next day disentangled a talk by Dr. Gagandeep Kaur on POCSO Act. In her concourse, the salient features of the act and steps to be taken for investigation of cases booked under this act were discussed in detail. She explained in detail the techniques to be adopted while making enquiry with the affected children. The participants took full advantage of the programme to update themselves with the POCSO Act. The teachers then witnessed the next session which was on "What makes an effective teacher for 21st century students". The resource person was Dr. Prabhat Kaushik, Director General-ZEE Learn Ltd. The session helped teachers to enhance their role as a mentor in the classroom and enable them to understand the requirements of the 21st century learners. A presentation was made on NABET by the teachers of Birla Balika









Vidyapeeth. Capt. (IN) Alokesh Sen, Principal Birla Public School gave a powerful talk on Global Competence. A session on CCE by Dr. M. Kasturi, Principal, Birla Balika Vidyapeeth and her team brought alive many aspects of the system.

An informative session on "Cyber Safety" was conducted by Miss. Karnika Seth. She discussed in detail about the application of safety and security preferences, social networks and online programmes. The presentation by the Director BET unfolded the events and features of the BET schools. The milestones achieved and the journey to be undertaken for the growth and exhilaration of the schools were discussed at length during his presentation.

Counselling is a very important ingredient in shaping students' behaviour and performance in schools. Students with various problems in schools need to be listened to, was the fact which was emphasised upon by Dr. VS Ravindran, ICTRC who took a session on Student Counselling.

Last three days of the Faculty Development Programme were devoted to the subject specific workshops that included teaching of fine arts as well as physical education besides the core subjects. Thus, the programme proved to be a powerful means of enhancing the intellectual capacity of the faculty members.
