Igniting the spirit of scientific thinking

JIGYASA – 2017 (Summer Science Research Camp)

A two-day science research camp 'Jigyasa-2017' was organised during July 7-8, 2017 at CSIR-CEERI, Pilani for the students of class 9, 10, 11, and 12 from the schools in and around Pilani, Rajasthan. The theme of the camp was to explore the world of electronics and allied engineering sciences. The camp was aimed at triggering and motivating the young minds towards the science through live interaction with the scientists and providing an opportunity to present their ideas. The programme was attended by 20 students from our school.

During this three-day program, various topics on conceptual understanding of scientific concepts were covered along with their practical demonstration. The students interacted with scientists and visited different labs of CEERI viz. Electron microscope Lab. Where they learnt how electron microscope works. Microwave tube division where children investigated about magnetron, travelling wave tubes, cathodes, klistron, mercury free UV lamp plasma water purifier. In gyrotron. Workshop – main points of attraction were lath machine and milling machine. Electronic control systems Lab. – Children were demonstrated about multiple sensors like infrared, SONAR, temperature sensor, strain gauge.



PCRA Competitions

Every year Petroleum Conservation Research Association(PCRA) under the aegis of Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas, Government of India conducts essay, painting and quiz competitions in the schools of India recognized by the Central and State Board of India.

In Birla Shishu Vihar too, Hindi, English essay writing, Science Quiz and Painting competitions were conducted on 01 September 2017. 68 participants took part in the competition. The topic was- 'Small Steps of Fuel Conservation Can Make Big Change'. Students exhibited active participation and started preparing for it a week before under the guidance of their teachers.

Basic Counseling Skills Workshop

Under the distinguished leadership of Mrs. Salony Priya, the esteemed director of Umeed foundation, a counseling workshop was conducted with an aim to impart basic counseling skills to teachers and train them in the domain of student counseling. During the sessions held on 5-6th of August and 17-18th of September, topics ranging from basic definition of counseling to various aspects and methods of counseling were elaborately discussed with the aid of brainstorming exercises and case studies.

The teachers improved their understanding of child psychology and behavior which they can employ in dealing with students to develop a stronger co-ordination with them and create a healthy environment for learning. A group of six teachers including Mrs. Namita Pareek, Mrs. Raj Choudhary, Mrs. Rekha Sharma, Mrs. Hargun Arora and Mrs. Meena Jangir attended the workshop along with teachers from other BET schools.
