EMPOWERING EMPATHY, SPARKING CREATIVITY

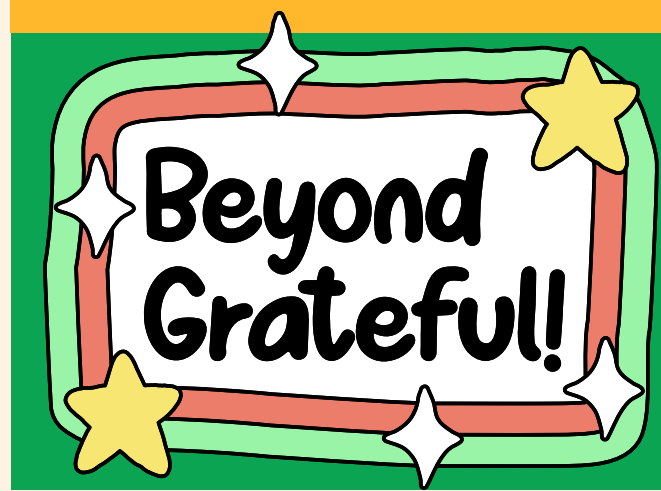
## Nurturing Sense of Appreciation Among UKG Students"

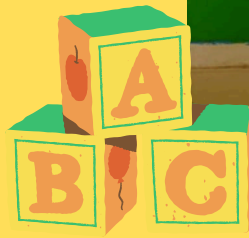
## **Day 2: July 16, 2024**

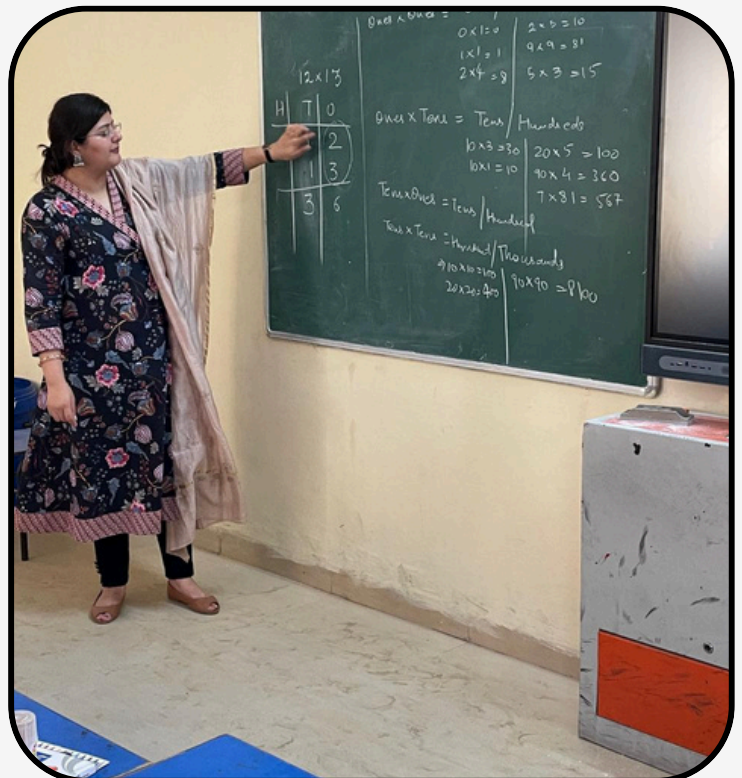
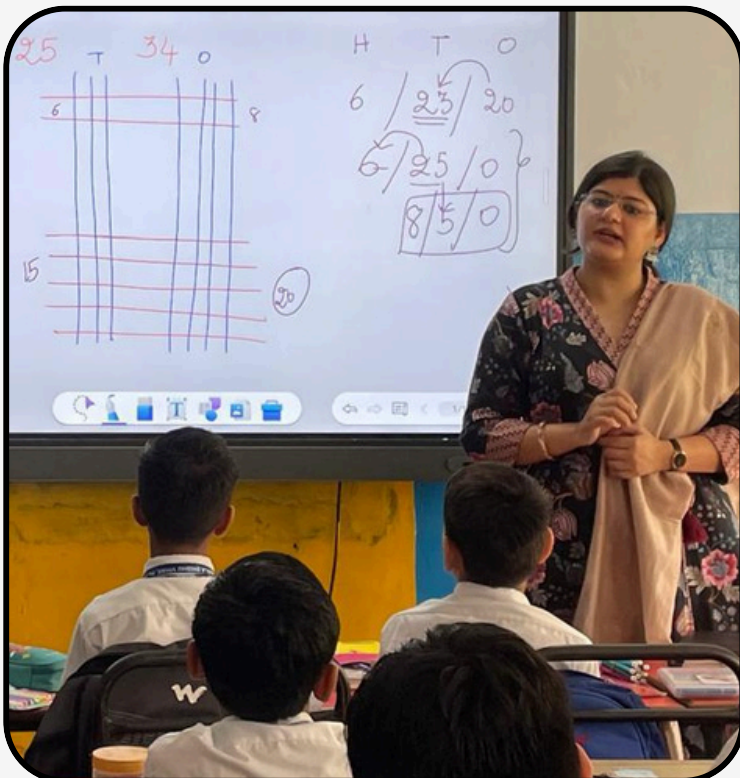




# Maths on go

- 4) Speaking activity on Save Earth.

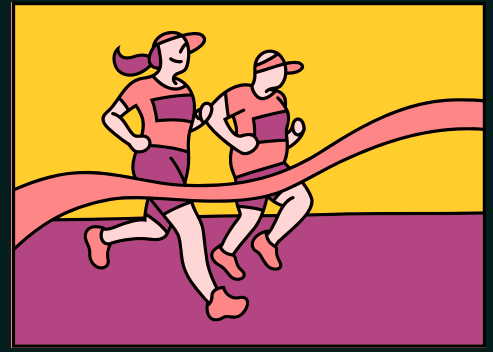
